The Mukaab's digitally enriched environ-

ment takes in many facets of technology and engineering that demand world-leading research and development and fresh perspectives on the use of power and data. Building it and New Murabba will position Saudi Arabia as a world leader in multiple industries.

New Murabba will integrate smart city technology to optimize resource management, Dyke said, including intelligent energy grids to balance supply and demand, sophisticated water-recycling systems to optimize consumption and integrated waste management solutions that promote a circular economy.
